Planning for Success

Determining goals for continued success is critical to continuous improvement in schools.

Goal 1

By June 2012, students identified in the target groups will demonstrate reading proficiency as determined by their grade three reading profile.

With our focus on bringing two schools together as a K-6 facility, West Meadow Elementary School has determined a single goal focus for 2010-2011. This will be re-evaluated in the fall of 2011, as two primary goal areas (division 2 learning supports and division 2 literacy instruction framework) have been delayed during this transitional year. This decision was determined through a staff collaborative process, recognizing the focus needed in this transition year.
